Acceptance of Terms

The following terms and conditions govern all use of the "Datarepository Unive" application and the services available therein (altogether, the "Service"). Use of the Service is offered subject to acceptance of and compliance with all the terms and conditions contained herein (the "General Terms of Use") and all other applicable operating rules, policies, and procedures of the Service. By clicking "I accept" and/or by your use of the Service, you agree and accept all the terms in this Datarepository Unive Terms of Use document.

Modification of Terms

Any changes in Datarepository Unive Terms of Use document will be notified via email to Users. Your continued use of the Service following the email posting of any changes to the Agreement constitutes acceptance of those changes. The Datarepository Unive Terms of Use document will be also downloadable from the Ca' Foscari web page "Datarepository Unive".

Definition of service

Datarepository Unive is an institutional multidisciplinary repository of research data. The service is offered to members of the scientific community of Ca' Foscari University of Venice (researchers and staff) who create, collect and/or manage research data. The service enables users to upload datasets, that are containers of files. A dataset is contained in one dataverse, which is created by Open Science Working Group (GLOS).

Supported users

Researchers must sign in with the institutional credentials. External partners must be authorized by the administrator of each dataverse.

Use of Datarepository Unive

The repository Datarepository Unive, based on Dataverse software, is intended to be used for sharing research data (e.g. research data at the basis of publications).

You do not need to deposit data that have already been published or received a DOI (or other persistent identifier) in other repositories (e.g. Zenodo).

However consider that, even if your data will not be open, metadata will be published.

Code of conduct

By depositing and submitting a dataset you acknowledge that:

- you are responsible for the content of the dataset
- the metadata (description of the data) is always publicly available even when files' access is restricted
- external users can download publicly available datasets from Datarepository Unive, taking into account the applied license and accepting best practices of data citation
- modifying files and uploading extra files (after publishing) will always result in a new version
- modified files still remain accessible in the previous version because of research integrity
- published datasets cannot been deleted. Only in cases of violations of data protection or intellectual property rights, the dataset can be deaccessioned by contacting openscience@unive.it. Deaccessioned files are no longer openly available, while the metadata will still be visible
- only in case of misconduct or scientific fraud, may the entire dataset be deleted.
