For students

Thank you for your interest in our Colloquium. Please find below some information.

Application. Applications to the first session can be submitted by filling the form available at https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSc83JvmWkpbffybGAnggdWjveO3-utyMrf6awflG8Y-gL3Sbw/viewform?usp=sf_link. You are kindly asked to give information about your doctoral status, upload your CV (including doctoral courses taken with grades) and the name of one faculty member from your doctoral program who will (separately) submit a reference letter to licalzi@unive.it with subject DoCRA: Reference Letter.

To ensure diversity, we cannot accept more than three students from the same program. To mitigate the risk of no-show, we ask you to confirm your intention by sending us a 120 euro deposit within five days from admission. This money will co-fund 10 light lunches for you during the weekdays. (We cover the rest of the expenses.)

Applications are processed on a first-in-first out basis, **after** the reference letter. Admissions are communicated immediately, up to 20 students. We keep a waiting list (same ordering) if a place opens up or the deposit is not received in time.

Attendance. You are expected to attend all lectures and related activities from Monday in the first week to Friday of the second week. There are no classes during the week-end.

Auditing. We have room to accommodate up to five **auditors** for each course. They may be doctoral students, or post-docs, or junior faculty within five years from obtaining their ph.d. Auditors are asked to fill a dedicated form at available at https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAlpQLSdKfc1ky9xqGotnoEA6lg2Pb u8vRY7ycB4H2s48Hc Um825wQ/viewform?usp=sf_link. We cannot offer financial help to auditors; in particular, they are responsible for their accommodation and any other necessary expense.

Auditing applications are processed on a first-in-first out basis. The reference letter or the Paypal payment are not required. Admissions are communicated immediately, up to 5 people. We keep a waiting list if a place opens up.

Location. The Colloquium takes place in the island of San Servolo, one boat stop from Piazza San Marco. The public service ("vaporetto") is number 20. Timetable: https://avm.avmspa.it/sites/default/files/avm/navigazione/Actv nav linea 20.pdf.

The island is the seat of Venice International University, and has lecture halls, study rooms, a library, as well as lodging and a restaurant. See https://servizimetropolitani.ve.it/en/san-servolo-island/where-we-are for more information.

Accommodation. Accommodation is at San Servolo (except in September). We will book (and pay for) your lodging in the island for 13 consecutive nights between the Sunday before the first class and the Saturday after the last class. Extensions are not possible. Meals are not covered.

If you plan not to use the first or the last night, please let us know as soon as possible

so that we can save some money. If you have special needs, please let us know.

Transportation. We reimburse your transportation costs, but we have to kindly ask you to abide by the following rules. Trains: we can reimburse any ticket (including flexible) in second class. Planes: we can reimburse any ticket in economy class. Please keep copies of your tickets (digital copies are ok).
