Activities

Grading

<u>All courses</u> (except Activities) are graded in accordance with these five levels: S=100-90, A=89-80, B=79-70, C=69-60, D=59-0. Below 60 is non-passing grade.

The basis for grading may be different from what you are familiar with. The following is an example of the Japanese language classes' grading system:

Exams (2 per semester)	40 %
Presentation Session	20 %
Performance /Attendance	40 %

Students' class performance and completion of assignments are evaluated within "Performance." Class attendance is also used to evaluate final grades.

Transfer Credits

Kokugakuin offers several credits for each course, but students must consult with their own university regarding credit conversion and transfer policies.

Japanese Conversational Partner	In addition to the individual relationships you build on your own, Kokugakuin arranges Japanese conversational partners. Japanese conversational partners will typically be a Kokugakuin undergraduate student who meets with the exchange student for regular, non-curricular sessions that allow the exchange student to practice Japanese conversation.
Friendship Family	A friendship family is a volunteer Japanese family that welcomes exchange students for occasional home visits or enjoys excursions with exchange students to provide students with better insight into typical Japanese families and lifestyles.
Work in Japan	K-STEP students are not encouraged to get a part-time work while staying in Japan as exchange students, however, we can assist you to get the temporary limited work permission during your stay.
