What is it?	It is an EU call for postdoctoral fellowships that opens yearly under the Horizon Europe funding programme. The call finances two kinds of fellowships: • EUROPEAN FELLOWSHIPS: individual research and training projects lasting between 1 and 2 years at Ca' Foscari. It is aimed at researchers residing outside Italy (both Italian and foreign) that intend to carry out their research with the supervision of a Ca' Foscari researcher. • GLOBAL FELLOWSHIPS: individual research and training projects in a non-EU country (from 1 to 2 years) plus a mandatory return period to Ca' Foscari (1 year). This fellowship allows researchers to be hosted in research institutions in a third country (es. USA, Canada, Australia, China,) and return to Ca' Foscari bringing in the acquired knowledge.	G@V - Research and Training for Global Challenges is a programme implemented by Ca' Foscari and jointly funded by the European Commission and Ca' Foscari through the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions COFUND scheme. The programme gives 15 talented researchers from all over the world the opportunity to undertake their research and training activity at Ca' Foscari University of Venice. The programme is supported by the University's corporate partners, including research centres, non-academic networks of spin-offs, and small and medium enterprises, where Fellows will have the opportunity to complete secondments, bridging the gap between academic and applied research, and between research and market. Applicants are requested to submit their research proposal in one of the six interdisciplinary Research for Global Challenges Institutes (RGCI) that will support them with their individual research and training needs. The second call for proposals will award a maximum of 7 Fellowships each lasting 24 months.

Research Fellows of any nationality on the date of the deadline must meet the following criteria to apply: PHD: Be in possession of a PhD degree awarded not later than 8 years prior to this call deadline. MAJOR PUBLICATION: Have at least one major publication without their PhD supervisor (either accepted, in press or published) at the time of deadline. MOBILITY RULE: Have not resided or carried out their main activity in Italy for longer than 12 months during the 3 years prior to the call deadline, in compliance with the MSCA mobility rule.
