FAQs PhD and Master programmes in Science and Management of Climate Change

Background

1. Which is the mandatory background knowledge required?

We require an introductory knowledge of statistics and linear algebra and basic calculus for maths.

PhD and Master's applications

- What will be the average timeline after application to receive admission decision?
 The selection process and the publication of the ranking is usually completed by the end of July. Please check the Master's webpage for specific deadlines.
- 2. Is a reference letter a requirement?
 - For the PhD application, the recommendation is to include two reference letters; they are not mandatory, but are usually taken in high consideration and give points in the first phase of the selection process.
 - No reference letter is required for the Master's application.
- Can the reference letter come from practitioners and not academics?Yes.
- 4. Is it mandatory to have the B2 certification or could it be enough to have a qualification like high school diploma or university qualification in Italy or abroad at the conclusion of a period of studies taught entirely in English?
 - For the PhD an official B2 certificate is mandatory. Please read carefully the section "Knowledge of the English language B2 level" on this page for possible exceptions: https://www.unive.it/web/en/2161/annual-call.
 - A language certificate is not mandatory for the Master.
- 5. For the PhD application, do we need to have a supervisor/tutor assigned already, or will this be decided once we are admitted ?
 - The supervisors are assigned by the end of the first year. They are not assigned in advance. The only exception are scholarships with a specific topic, where the professor who promoted the scholarship is usually the supervisor.

7. Are there any age limits for the programmes?

There are no age limits to apply to our programmes.

8. What is the share of students admitted to the PhD programme who come from the Master's programmes in Science and Management of Climate Change?

The acceptance rate for the PhD is about 10%.

PhD application - Research proposal

1. Should prospective PhD candidates submit a research proposal while applying?

2. Do PhD candidates get a topic for their research proposal?

General topics are listed in Annex A in the PhD annual call. It is up to the candidate to elaborate a convincing research proposal.

3. Is there any specific format of research proposal?

No, there is none. The annual call only states the maximum length of the proposal.

Classes and scholarship

1. What is the weekly commitment in terms of lesson hours?

One up to three classes take place almost every day from Monday to Friday; moreover, the attendance in person is mandatory.

2. Is it possible to attend the Master programme remotely?

No, the attendance is exclusively in person.
